The Logic: Wrestling isn't just about what happens between the bells; it's about the gates you draw. Dusty’s emotional appeal to the common man has set the Mid-South RANKINGS on fire. He earns this for being the emotional heartbeat of the organization.

4. Mike Cook (PNW) (SOS)

The Achievement: The last man standing for the SOS stable.

The Logic: While the rest of the Cook family and Jim Needhart suffered a string of high-profile losses, the Pacific Northwest version of Mike Cook held the line. He defended the Western States title against the top-tier "Æ" threat, Ayatollah M. He is the only reason the SOS stable still has a seat at the champions' table.

5. Hayden “S.P.” Michaels (BURN/TFF)

The Achievement: Leading the "Loading Dock Massacre" and consistent technical wins.

The Logic: Michaels proved that the Freebirds are the most dangerous unit in the IWA. Beyond the backstage attack, his win over Monster Kong in Card 40 (+2) showed he is a top-tier tactical wrestler who can out-think and out-grapple anyone in the league.

Cut to the backstage interview area. Bobby "The Brain" Higginbotham steps into frame, impeccably dressed as always, straightening his tie and adjusting his lapels before he even acknowledges the camera. He holds up one finger before the interviewer can say a word.

Higginbotham: "Before anybody asks me anything, I have a statement to make. And I want everybody in this building, everybody watching at home, and most importantly, I want Commissioner Whoever-He-Thinks-He-Is to sit down, shut his mouth, and listen very carefully, because I am only going to say this once.

Triple Header Faction.

Triple. Header. Faction.

That is what the Commissioner put in his little report. His official, on-the-record, OSL Commissioner Report. And I read it, and I nearly choked. I nearly fell out of my chair. Triple Header Faction. Can you imagine? Can you imagine the nerve? The ignorance? The absolute, unmitigated gall of a man sitting behind a desk, collecting a paycheck, calling himself a Commissioner, and not even knowing what he is looking at?"

He pauses and smooths his hair back, composing himself with visible effort.

Higginbotham: "Let me educate you, Commissioner. Free of charge. Consider it a gift from the smartest man in professional wrestling today.

THF does not stand for Triple Header Faction. THF stands for The Higginbotham Family. T-H-F. The Higginbotham Family. My family. My stable. My investment in the future of this business. And what a magnificent investment it has turned out to be."

He begins to pace slightly, working himself up with genuine pride.

Higginbotham: "While the Commissioner was busy misspelling my legacy in his little report, Mighty Joe Daddio was out there doing what Mighty Joe Daddio does, which is destroy everything that gets put in front of him. Joe Daddio is the OSL American Champion. The American Champion. Do you understand what that means? That title belongs to The Higginbotham Family now. Joe walked into that match like a freight train with bad intentions, and he walked out with gold around his waist, and there is not a single man on this roster who can do a thing about it. Not one."

He holds up a second finger.

Higginbotham: "And if that was not enough, and trust me, it is more than enough for most people, Matt Bockwinkel is the OSL Unified Japan Champion. Matt Bockwinkel. The most technically sound, the most strategically brilliant, the most complete professional wrestler to lace up a pair of boots in this organization. He did not just win that championship. He earned it. He dissected his opponent like the surgeon that he is, and he walked away with the Unified Japan title, and he will carry it with the class and dignity that a champion of his caliber deserves."

He stops and faces the camera directly.

Higginbotham: "So let us review, Commissioner, since you seem to need the help. The Higginbotham Family holds the OSL American Championship. The Higginbotham Family holds the OSL Unified Japan Championship. And the next time you put out one of your little reports, you will get our name right. Because we have earned that. We have more than earned that.

Triple Header Faction."

He scoffs and shakes his head slowly.

Higginbotham: "The man ought to be embarrassed. I know I am embarrassed for him."

He straightens his tie one final time and walks off camera without another word.

The arena is still buzzing. Thirty-three thousand people who came tonight knowing they might see something special, and got exactly that and then some. Thirty-six minutes and forty-four seconds of the hardest fought championship match this league has seen in recent memory, and when it was over, "Beautiful" Bobby Lee was flat on the canvas and the OSL Alliance Championship was changing hands.

Jed Duggan is standing in the middle of the ring.

He is not a pretty man and he knows it and he does not care. His hair is plastered to his forehead. His chest is heaving. There is a red welt running across his left shoulder from where Bobby Lee worked it for the better part of twenty minutes, and there is a small cut above his right eye that has been wiped but not quite closed. He has the Alliance Championship belt in one hand and a two-by-four piece of lumber in the other, and he is raising both of them toward the rafters like a man who just climbed a mountain and wants everyone in the valley to know it.

The crowd is giving it to him. All of it.

The ring announcer hands him the microphone.

Duggan looks at it for a second like he is trying to remember what it is for. Then he grins.

"HOOOOOO!"

Thirty-three thousand people answer him back and the building shakes.

"You know something, I have been in a lot of fights in my life. A lot of fights. Bar fights, street fights, wrestling matches that turned into something else somewhere in the middle. I have been hit with everything you can think of and some things you probably cannot. And I want to be honest with you people tonight, because you deserve honesty from your champion.

Bobby Lee is one of the toughest men I have ever been in a ring with in my entire life.

I mean that. That man right there worked my shoulder for thirty minutes trying to take the spear away from me. Thirty minutes of armbars and hammerlocks and every nasty little trick a technical wrestler has in his bag. And he is good. You all saw it. The man is good.

But here is the thing about Jed Duggan that Bobby Lee and Jim Clarinet maybe did not fully account for.

I do not quit.

I do not quit when my shoulder is on fire. I do not quit when I am bleeding. I do not quit when some fancy manager in a sport coat is screaming at the referee from ringside trying to steal what I earned. I have been knocked down in this ring and I have gotten back up every single time, and tonight was no different.

That running block, that spear, that is not just a move. That is everything I have got put into one moment. That is every early morning, every long drive, every hard match in every town that nobody ever heard of that made me the man standing in this ring right now. When I hit Bobby Lee with that tonight, I hit him with all of it. Every bit of it.

And here I stand.

Now. I know Jim Clarinet is in the back right now with a cold towel on Bobby Lee's head and a list of excuses already written out. I know that is coming. Clarinet is a smart man and I will give him that, he is a smart man who is going to have something to say about tonight. And that is fine. Clarinet can talk all he wants, because that belt is right here and I am the one holding it.

I want every man in this locker room to look at what happened tonight. I want them to look at thirty-six minutes of Bobby Lee throwing everything he had at me and me still being the last man standing. I want them to think real hard about whether they want to step up and test Jed Duggan.

Because the answer to that question is yes. The answer is always yes. You want a shot at this belt, you come find me. I will be right here. I am not hard to locate. I am the big loud one with the two-by-four and the championship.

HOOOOOO!"

The music hits. Duggan raises the belt one more time. He climbs the second rope in the corner and holds it out toward the crowd, turning to all four sides of the arena.

Thirty-three thousand people in the Quad Cities send him off like a king.

The OSL Alliance Championship has a new home.

The arena is still buzzing from the match. Red River Brody does not wait for an interviewer. He snatches the microphone out of someone's hand at ringside, chest heaving, the North American title belt clutched in his massive fist. His hair is wild, his boots are still laced, and there is fire in his eyes that has not cooled down one degree since the bell rang.

Brody: HUSS. HUSS.

He raises the belt over his head with one arm, turning slowly so every corner of the Crown Coliseum can see it.

Twenty-nine minutes and thirteen seconds. That is how long it took me to take what is mine. Twenty-nine minutes of Doomtrigger throwing everything he had at Red River Brody. Everything. And you know what I did? I ate it. I absorbed every single bit of it, and I kept coming. Because that is what I do. That is what I have always done. You cannot stop me. You can slow me down for a minute, maybe two, but you cannot stop me.

He looks down at the belt in his hand, almost studying it.

Doomtrigger thought he was going to walk into Crown Coliseum and hold onto that title. He had his plans. He had his strategy. He had everything figured out except for one thing. He did not figure on what happens when Red River Brody decides he wants something. When I set my sights on something, there is no plan in the world that accounts for that. There is no strategy that prepares you for twenty-six thousand people watching you find out what a jumping knee drop from this man feels like when the lights are all the way on and the title is on the line.

He finally slings the belt over his shoulder and grabs the top rope with his free hand.

I have been in this business a long time. I have been in every kind of building, every kind of city, against every kind of man they wanted to put across the ring from me. And every single time, the story ends the same way. Red River Brody is still standing. Red River Brody is still breathing. And tonight, Red River Brody is your new OSL North American Champion.

He holds the belt up one more time, close to the camera.

HUSS.

He drops the microphone and walks back up the aisle, belt raised, not looking back at anything or anyone.

The Rocket Launcher has just connected. Ricky Fame and Dr. Only Eats the Medulla are down. The referee's hand hits the mat for three and the Myriad comes alive as "Beautiful" Bobby Lee and "Loveboy" Dennis Jackson are handed the OSL Unified Tag Team Championships. The belts catch the arena light and both men hold them up without saying a word, because neither of them needs to say anything yet.

That is what Jim Clarinet is for.

Clarinet is already in motion before the ring announcer finishes the official declaration. He has his sport coat on, his tennis racket under his arm, and the microphone in his hand before anyone has thought to hand it to him. He straightens his collar, surveys the crowd with the particular expression of a man who finds the world only barely adequate, and begins.

"Thank you. Thank you very much. I know, I know, it is a lot to take in all at once. Two championships. One stable. One very brilliant manager. Some people in this business spend their whole careers chasing one belt. The Midnight Express and Jim Clarinet collect them.

Now. Before I talk about what just happened in this ring tonight, and I will get to it because it deserves to be discussed properly, I want to address the elephant in the room. Because there are people out there, columnists and commentators and jealous little men in the back who have been waiting for months to hang something around my neck, and they think they finally have something.

They want to talk about Jed Duggan.

Fine. Let us talk about Jed Duggan.

Bobby Lee carried the OSL Alliance Championship through the entire Spring season. The entire season. Card one, United Center, thirty-four thousand people, Doomtrigger. Forty minutes and five seconds of Doomtrigger throwing everything he had, and Bobby Lee put him away with the Alabama Jam. Card two, Five Seasons Center, Tim Hart, who fancies himself some kind of professional. Twenty-five minutes. Alabama Jam. Goodnight. Card three, Ford Idaho Center, Monster Kong. A man that size, and Bobby Lee wrestled him from pillar to post for twenty-seven minutes and put him on the mat clean. Card four, the IWA Arena, Mighty Joe Daddio, forty-four minutes, the longest defense of the season, and Bobby Lee still closed the show.

Four defenses. Four Alabama Jams. Four men who thought they could take what Bobby Lee had and went home without it.

Then came Jed Duggan.

I am not going to stand here and tell you Jed Duggan is not a tough man. He is a tough man. He is a big, hard-headed, two-by-four swinging tough man, and on that particular night at the MARK of the Quad Cities he caught Bobby at the end of thirty-six minutes of everything Bobby had given him and he got the pin. It happened. The number is in the record book and I cannot change what is in the record book.

What I can tell you is this. One loss does not define Bobby Lee. Five championship defenses and one loss at the end of a grueling season tells you exactly who Bobby Lee is. It tells you he is a man who shows up and fights

every single time. The people in this business who want to point at that one night and use it to write Bobby off have apparently not been watching the same season I have been watching.

And here is the other thing I will tell you about Jed Duggan. That belt is going to get heavy. Running around with a two-by-four and hollering is a fine way to win a crowd, but it is not a long-term championship strategy. Jed Duggan is going to find out real soon that holding a championship is a different business than chasing one. And when that moment comes, the Midnight Express will be right there.

But tonight. Tonight is not about Jed Duggan. Tonight belongs to these two men right here."

Clarinet turns and extends an arm toward Bobby Lee and Dennis Jackson, who are standing together with the tag belts over their shoulders.

"I want to say something about Dennis Jackson, because Dennis deserves it said out loud in front of everybody. There are people in this locker room, younger guys, guys who think they know what this business is, and they look at Dennis and they see a man in his thirties who has been around the block, and they make the mistake of thinking that means something is running out. What is running out, gentlemen, is your patience, because Dennis Jackson is operating right now at a level that most men in this business never reach. Smart. Physical. Mean when he needs to be. Technically as sound as anyone in this league.

And together? Together these two men are the best tag team in the world. I do not say that for effect. I say it because it is a factual statement and the Unified Tag Team Championships around their waists are the evidence.

Now. I have been around this business since before some of the boys in the back knew what a wristlock was. I grew up around promoters and arenas and the kind of people who built this industry from the ground floor. And in all that time, through everything I have seen and learned and yes, engineered, I have never managed a tag team that was better constructed to dominate a division than the Midnight Express.

Bobby Lee and Dennis Jackson do not need to be told what to do. They do not need play-by-play instructions from the apron. They think together. They move together. They have a chemistry that you cannot manufacture and you cannot teach. You either have it or you do not, and they have it in a way that should honestly frighten every other tag team in this building.

To Ricky Fame and Dr. Only Eats the Medulla, I will say this. You pushed them tonight. Twenty-seven minutes is not nothing and I will not pretend it is. But there is a difference between pushing the Midnight Express and beating them, and tonight you found out where that line is drawn.

The Midnight Express are the OSL Unified Tag Team Champions. Bobby Lee is a former OSL Alliance Champion and he will be again. And I, Jim Clarinet, am twenty-five years old, the smartest man in professional wrestling, and we are just getting started.

I want everybody to think about that last part real carefully."

Clarinet lowers the microphone and smooths his jacket. Dennis Jackson drapes the tag belt over his shoulder with the easy comfort of a man who has been here before and expected to be here again. Bobby Lee says nothing. He never has to.

The Midnight Express stands in the center of the Myriad ring with two championships between them, and the crowd in Oklahoma City gives them exactly the reaction they deserve.

The music plays them out.

The double dropkick lands at twenty-eight minutes and twelve seconds and Gund Arena loses its mind. Masked Donald Trump and The Grimacing Gaze are down and the referee is counting and when his hand hits the mat for three the building goes from loud to something beyond loud, the kind of noise that vibrates in your chest and stays there for a week.

The OSL TV Tag Team Championships are handed over and Punky Morton and Hoot Gibson hold them up and the crowd in Cleveland just keeps going.

The ring announcer does his job but nobody can really hear him over it.

Eventually Punky gets the microphone. He is breathing hard and grinning harder and his hair is everywhere and he looks exactly like a man who just had the best night of his life.

Punky Morton:

"CLEVELAND!"

The building answers.

"I want you to know something. I want you to know that me and Hoot, we have been a tag team for a long time. We have been up and we have been down and we have traveled every road this business has got, and there have been nights where we wondered if a night like this was coming or not. And I am standing here right now telling you that every single one of those nights was worth it for this one.

Twenty-eight minutes tonight. Twenty-eight minutes of Masked Donald Trump and the Grimacing Gaze doing everything in their power to keep these belts away from us. And I will give them this much, they are tough. They made us work for every second of it. But here is the thing about the Rock and Roll Express that people keep forgetting and then remembering the hard way.

We do not stop moving.

That is it. That is the whole secret if you want to call it a secret. Me and Hoot, we do not slow down, we do not get tired, we do not stand in the middle of the ring and wait for something to happen. We make it happen. We have been making it happen since the day we got together and we made it happen again tonight in Cleveland.

Hoot, get over here."

Hoot Gibson steps up beside him. He is calmer about it than Punky, quieter, but the smile is real and the championship belt on his shoulder is real and the thirty-five thousand people in this building are very real.

Punky throws an arm around him.

"This man right here is the best tag team partner in professional wrestling. I mean that. Not in this league. Not on this roster. In professional wrestling. Full stop. There is nobody I would rather have beside me and nobody who has had my back better and longer than Hoot Gibson, and tonight we are both TV Tag Team Champions and I just need everybody in this building to appreciate what they just watched, because what they just watched was the Rock and Roll Express at full speed and it is a beautiful thing."

He holds the belt up one more time and the crowd gives it right back to him.

Then Hoot takes the microphone. He looks at it for a moment, then out at the crowd, then back at Punky. He is a man who picks his words because he means every one of them.

Hoot Gibson:

"I am not going to talk as long as Punky. I never do.

I am going to say that we came into Cleveland tonight with one goal. One goal. And we are leaving with the TV Tag Team Championships. That is the whole story.

But I do want to say this. There are tag teams in this league who have been sleeping on the Rock and Roll Express. Teams who looked at us and thought they saw something other than what we are. I do not know what they thought they saw. Maybe they saw two guys who have been around long enough that the edge is supposed to be off. Maybe they thought the double dropkick was not coming or that we could not keep up for twenty-eight minutes.

I hope they were watching tonight. I genuinely hope every tag team in this league was watching, because what they saw is what they are going to get if they come for these championships.

We are the Rock and Roll Express. We are the OSL TV Tag Team Champions.

Cleveland, thank you."

Hoot hands the microphone back without ceremony. Punky immediately raises his belt again because Punky Morton is constitutionally incapable of not milking a moment, and the crowd in Gund Arena loves him for it completely.

The Rock and Roll Express music hits and thirty-five thousand people in Cleveland dance along whether they mean to or not.

The bulldog connects and Bobby Jack Valentine puts Seventh Son of the Seventh Son on the mat and the referee counts three and the UTC Arena in Chattanooga, Tennessee has itself a moment. The TV Six-Man Championships change hands and the Fantastic Freebirds stand over their fallen opponents with the particular stillness of men who expected exactly this outcome and are not especially surprised by it.

Gordon Terry rolls his neck. Bobby Jack Valentine spits toward the ropes. Hayden Michaels runs both hands back through his hair and takes the microphone like it belongs to him, which as far as he is concerned it always has.

Hayden "Simply Perfect" Michaels:

"Chattanooga. How are you doing tonight?"

No, no, I am not really asking. I do not actually care. I am being polite because my mama raised me right and because we are standing in the great state of Tennessee and I have some manners when the situation calls for it.

What I do care about, what I care about very deeply and personally, is what is happening in this ring right now. What is happening in this ring right now is the Fantastic Freebirds are your new OSL TV Six-Man Tag Team Champions. Look at these belts. Look at them. Are those not the most beautiful things you have ever seen in your life? They are now, because we are holding them, and everything we touch becomes more beautiful by association. That is just science.

Now. Ayatollah M, Caliber Cade, Seventh Son of the Seventh Son. AE. What does that stand for? Arts & Entertainment?

I want to say something to you three and I want to mean it when I say it. You gave us twenty-nine minutes and forty-six seconds of a fight tonight. A real fight. And that is the most respect I am going to show you so enjoy it while it lasts, because it is not coming again.

Bobby Jack. Get over here."

Valentine steps up. He is not a talker and everyone in the building knows it and he knows it and he does not pretend otherwise. He just stands there looking like trouble that has already been decided on.

"This man right here pinned Seventh Son of the Seventh Son in the middle of this ring clean as a whistle, and anybody who wants to argue with that result is welcome to come down here and argue with Bobby Jack personally. I will wait.

No takers. Shocking.

And then there is Gordon Terry."

Michaels looks over at Terry, who is standing with his arms folded and his championship belt resting on one enormous shoulder like it weighs nothing at all.

"There is not a man alive, not one man in any locker room on this earth, who I would rather have standing beside me in a six-man situation than Gordon Bam Bam Terry. You want to talk about a force of nature? You want to talk about somebody who changes the entire calculation of a match just by being in it? That is Gordon Terry. Twenty-nine minutes tonight and he was just as dangerous in minute twenty-nine as he was in minute one. That is not conditioning. That is not training. That is Gordon Terry being Gordon Terry and there is nothing you can do about it.

Now. I want to talk about something else. I want to talk about where we come from, because I think it matters. I think context matters.

We come from Badstreet. Badstreet USA. If you know what that means then you already understand everything about this team that there is to understand. If you do not know what that means, let me explain it to you. Badstreet is a state of mind. It is the place you come from when the rules were always more of a suggestion than a requirement. When you learned early that the world does not hand you anything and that what you take and hold onto is yours and what you cannot hold is gone. We did not come up soft. We did not come up with somebody's hand on our back steering us toward the right doors. We came up the hard way and we are better for it and the men who tried to come up against us tonight found that out at twenty-nine minutes and forty-six seconds.

And Fantasia. I want to talk about Fantasia for just a second, because Fantasia is not just a place. Fantasia is the dream. It is what you are working toward when Badstreet is where you started. It is the other end of the road. The Fantastic Freebirds live on both ends of that road at the same time, and that is what makes us different from every other team in this league or any other. We are street and we are spectacle. We are mean and we are magnificent. We are Bobby Jack Valentine and Gordon Terry and Hayden Simply Perfect Michaels, and tonight in Chattanooga, Tennessee we are your TV Six-Man Tag Team Champions.

Freebird forever.

That is not a catchphrase. That is a way of life.

Now somebody put our music on."

The music hits before he finishes the sentence. Michaels throws both arms wide and turns a slow circle in the ring, soaking in a crowd that is giving him everything, admiration and heat in roughly equal measure, which is exactly the ratio he prefers.

Terry and Valentine stand on either side of him with the championships, saying nothing, needing to say nothing, because Hayden Michaels has already said everything and said it the way only Hayden Michaels can.

The Fantastic Freebirds own the TV Six-Man Championships.

Chattanooga has witnessed it.

HACKSAW JED DUGGAN — **STEEL FEDERATION CHAMPION**

The camera finds Jed Duggan in the locker room, the massive Steel Federation championship belt draped over his shoulder. He is sweating, still breathing hard from the tournament. His eyes are wild with triumph.

JED DUGGAN: You want to know what it takes? You want to know what it takes to stand on top of the whole Steel Federation? I will tell you what it takes. It takes being the toughest, meanest, most hard-headed man in this entire federation, and brother, that man is Hacksaw Jed Duggan!

I went through ALL of them. Axel from the EWL thought his fancy European style was going to stop me. WRONG. Mike Drake from the LPL thought he was going to ride that VIRUS machine all the way to the top. WRONG. Killer Karl Kowalski from the LSL — now there is a man who has made careers miserable for a long time — came at me with everything he had. Not enough. Not nearly enough. Roderick Rampage from the MUL tried to take my head off. Vodka Nikolov, my own BURN brother, stepped up and made me earn every single inch of it — and I respect him for that, because that is what BURN is made of. And the Sin City Gambler from the WDL? Son, you gambled on the wrong man.

Six champions. Six of the best this entire federation has to offer. And not one of them could put Hacksaw Jed Duggan down.

He grabs the belt off his shoulder and holds it up with both hands, the camera catching the light bouncing off the gold.

JED DUGGAN: This right here is the Steel Federation championship. This right here means I am the best champion in Steel. Not just the OSL. Not just my league. The whole Federation. From top to bottom, coast to coast, I beat every last one of them, and this belt is the proof.

He slaps the side of the belt hard and stares into the camera.

JED DUGGAN: HOOOOO!

THE ROCK AND ROLL EXPRESS — IWA U.S. TAG-TEAM CHAMPIONS

Punky Morton and Hoot Gibson come charging into frame, the IWA U.S. tag-team titles raised high, both of them grinning ear to ear. The energy is electric from the first second.

PUNKY MORTON: YEAH! Yeah yeah yeah! You are looking at the IWA United States tag-team champions, baby! Punky Morton and Hoot Gibson! The Rock and Roll Express! And we are telling every single person in this building and everyone watching at home — THIS IS WHAT WE DO!

HOOT GIBSON: You know what the most fun thing in the world is? It is getting in that ring with your best friend beside you and just GOING. Just going out there and reminding every tag team in this business why the Rock and Roll Express has been turning arenas upside down for months. Because we never stopped. We never slowed down. We are the fastest, most electric team in professional wrestling, and now we have the gold to prove it.

PUNKY MORTON: People counted us out. People said that Rock & Roll was dead and we were too small. They said that. And you know what we said back?

He holds the title up directly to the camera.

PUNKY MORTON: We said THIS. Right here. That is our answer.

HOOT GIBSON: Every team in the OSL, every team in the IWA that wants a shot at these belts — bring it. We want it. We have always wanted it. Come find the Rock and Roll Express because we will be easy to find. We will be right in the middle of the biggest, loudest, most fired-up crowd in whatever building we walk into.

PUNKY MORTON: Because that is what Rock and Roll is, baby! That is what it has always been! The people and the music and the energy and these two championships right here!

Both men raise the titles again as the crowd noise surges in the background.

HOOT GIBSON: U.S. tag-team champions. Rock and Roll Express. And we are RUNNING this division.

THE FANTASTIC FREEBIRDS — IWA U.S. SIX-MAN CHAMPIONS

All three Freebirds are on camera. Hayden Michaels is posed in the center with his arms crossed, surveying the scene with supreme self-satisfaction. Gordon Terry stands to his left, loose and menacing. Bobby Valentine flanks them on the right, his championship belt slung casually over one shoulder like it weighs nothing.

HAYDEN MICHAELS: You know what the hardest thing about being the Fantastic Freebirds is? It is deciding which one of us to be jealous of, because frankly, all three of us are outstanding. Simply Perfect Hayden Michaels. Bam Bam Gordon Terry. Bobby Jack Valentine. And now — IWA United States six-man champions.

GORDON TERRY: Nobody wanted to see this happen. You understand me? Nobody in that locker room, nobody in that front office, nobody in any of these arenas wanted to see the Freebirds with gold around our waists. And that right there is exactly why it makes me feel so tremendously good.

BOBBY VALENTINE: The six-man division just changed. Everything about it just changed. Because before today there was some question about who the standard was in IWA six-man tag-team wrestling. There is no question now. You are looking at the standard. You are looking at the gold.

HAYDEN MICHAELS: I have been Simply Perfect since the day I walked into this sport. Gordon has been hitting harder than everyone in the room since the beginning. Bobby Jack has been taking people apart from the jump. And the three of us together? Together we are something that this entire organization has no answer for. None. We just proved that.

GORDON TERRY: Any six-man team — any three men anywhere in the IWA who think they can come take these titles — you have my personal invitation to try. Personally. From Bam Bam Gordon Terry. I would love nothing more.

Hayden Michaels steps forward and looks into the lens with complete composure.

HAYDEN MICHAELS: The Fantastic Freebirds. United States six-man tag-team champions. And simply put? We are the best thing happening in this business right now. We have always known it. The rest of you are just now catching up.

He smooths his hair back with one hand and nods slowly.

HAYDEN MICHAELS: Simply Perfect. As advertised.

THE MIDNIGHT EXPRESS —

IWA WORLD TAG-TEAM CHAMPIONS

Jim Clarinet stands out in front of the OSL banner like a man conducting a symphony only he can hear, the IWA World Tag-Team Championships gleaming behind him. One belt is slung proudly over each shoulder of the team. The grin on his face looks less like satisfaction and more like someone who just proved the universe wrong out of sheer stubborn insistence. He leans into the camera first, voice sharp, fast, and already halfway into a rant that sounds rehearsed but never actually is.

JIM CLARINET:

Let me explain something to every so-called expert, every gym-rat philosopher, every tag team that thinks they understand what they are looking at. You are not looking at luck. You are not looking at a fluke. You are looking at the most finely tuned tag team wrestling machine in the history of this sport.

He gestures behind him, almost dismissively, as if the champions are obvious background scenery to the point he is making.

JIM CLARINET:

Because when you talk about tag team wrestling, you are talking about timing, psychology, precision, punishment, and survival. And there is not a team alive that has ever done it better than the Midnight Express.

shifts slightly beside him. He doesn't step forward. He barely even commits to being on camera. He just mutters like the thought arrived halfway through his mouth.

BOBBY LEE:

Yeah... we just... do what we do.

Clarinet snaps his head toward him like a conductor correcting a single off-note in an orchestra.

JIM CLARINET:

Exactly. And that right there is the difference. While other teams are out there talking about legacy, talking about opportunity, talking about what they are going to do, the Midnight Express just shows up and takes it.

Behind them, adjusts the tag title at his waist, calm but confident, letting Clarinet set the pace like a man perfectly comfortable letting a storm speak for him.

JIM CLARINET:

Now I've heard the questions for years. "When is the Midnight Express going to reach the top?" "When are they going to prove it on the biggest stage?" Well, I've got your answer. You are looking at it. Right now. In real time.

He steps closer to the camera, voice tightening, intensity rising like a wire about to snap.

JIM CLARINET:

And every team in that locker room better understand something very simple. These are not transitional champions. These are not placeholder names. These are the men you measure yourself against and realize you are not even in the same sport.

Bobby Lee gives another small shrug, eyes half-lidded, like the whole thing is obvious.

BOBBY LEE:

We... just try to win.

Clarinet laughs once, sharp and humorless, as if that understatement is the most dangerous thing of all.

JIM CLARINET:

And that is why nobody stops them.

He spreads his arms slightly, framing both champions like prized artifacts in a museum that just became a battlefield.

JIM CLARINET:

So let me make this perfectly clear to the entire tag team division. You want these belts? Then you are going to have to outthink them. Outfight them. Outlast them. And nobody, I repeat nobody, has managed to do all three at once.

Dennis Jackson finally looks up, calm and steady.

DENNIS JACKSON:

We're not going anywhere.

Clarinet nods like that was the only correct answer in the universe.

JIM CLARINET:

And that, ladies and gentlemen, is the Midnight Express. IWA World Tag-Team Champions.

The camera lingers a moment longer as Clarinet's smile returns, sharp and satisfied, while Bobby Lee looks like he is already halfway to the next match without ever leaving the room.
