






































Luthor Alexander – NWL Commissioner

Luthor brought him into the NWL to manage operations, including the expansion of the arena's fixins bar, a task Jack surprisingly admired.

Mr. T – Head of NWL Security

Once an A-list celebrity from The A-Team, Mr. T is a longtime friend of Luthor and former bodyguard. Now, he oversees NWL security, bringing his no-nonsense attitude to the role. His reputation and iconic image keep wrestlers and fans in line, making him a valuable asset to the league.

Jimmy Lennon III – Ring Announcer

Following in the footsteps of his father and grandfather, Jimmy brings professionalism, elegance, and his catchphrase "It's showtime!" to NWL events. Known for his precision and showmanship, he is respected by Luthor, even though Luthor finds him a bit of a "goodie two shoes."



Lance Catamaran – NWL Play-by-Play Announcer

Once an objective commentator in the IWL, Lance shifted alliances to support Luthor. Now a full supporter of Luthor's reign, Lance has become a divisive figure in wrestling, known for praising Luthor's actions and advocating for his rule. His journey from neutral announcer to Luthor's "PR man" makes him one of the most controversial voices in the NWL.

Pierre Roulette – NWL Color Analyst

A former bookmaker with ties to the Gambino crime family, Pierre is a gritty commentator known for his 1970s-style mafia persona. Luthor bailed him out of prison and brought him back to the NWL to add a touch of unpredictability to broadcasts. He pairs well with the NWL's rugged environment, adding a mix of street smarts and humor to commentary.

Vic Venom – NWL Journalist

With a heavy New York accent and a disdain for rookies and modern wrestling, Vic believes in entertainment and character-driven stories over in-ring skill. A former editor for IWL Wrestling Wrap-Up, Vic is a vocal critic of Johnny B and a major advocate for story-driven wrestling. His distaste for Samantha Solie and women in general adds to his notorious image.

Clarence Cockrand – NWL Legal Counsel

A flamboyant and ruthless lawyer, Clarence is willing to do anything to win a case. The heir to the O. Henry candy bar fortune, he's known for his wealth, charisma, and lack of ethics. Clarence has never lost a case for Luthor, and currently, he's suing CWL, Johnny B, Lazarus Lane, and Samantha Solie on Luthor's behalf.



Todd Okerlund – NWL Backstage Interviewer

A former NHL draftee, Todd brings a classy professionalism to backstage interviews. Following his father's footsteps, he's known as the voice of the NWL and is beloved by fans for his quick wit and calm demeanor. Todd's presence adds a polished, sports-like feel to the NWL.

Dr. George Zahorian II – NWL Physician

A former Willowick, Ohio gynecologist with a history of dispensing anabolic steroids, Dr. Zahorian spent years in prison for his controversial medical practices. Luthor brought him back as the NWL physician, where he now works in the Asylum's dungeon, creating "supplements" for wrestlers. Known for his questionable ethics, he prioritizes money and ego over patient care.

Tito Santana – NWL Trainer

A respected veteran, Tito brings class, experience, and integrity to the NWL. Outside wrestling, he's known as a trainer at the National Wrestling League. Luthor respects him enough to make him a trainer for the NWL, where he teaches with dignity and a strong sense of professionalism.

Bob Rodgers – NWL Trainer

A tough-as-nails former wrestler from the 1980s, Bob has a notorious reputation for physically abusing students and fraternizing with their mothers. Fired from the NWL in 2017, he was later found homeless in the woods by Luthor and Jack Cornette, who brought him back to train rookies with his old-school methods. He is friends with Jack Cornette and holds a deep disdain for Tito Santana.



Phil Alfonso – Veteran NWL Referee

An eccentric referee, Phil claims to have officiated matches worldwide—and even on the moon. Rumored to have once been a patient at Pilgrim State, he's made outlandish claims like being Ronald Reagan's son or Jeremy Supiran from Small Wonder. Whether crazy or a compulsive liar, he's an enigmatic presence in the league and a great referee.

Jimmy Ross – NWL Referee

A 19-year-old wrestling enthusiast and nephew of Jim Ross, Jimmy is a clean-cut, all-American boy scout who adores wrestling so much he pays Luthor to work in the NWL. His youthful energy and enthusiasm make him a standout among the NWL staff

Manny Davis – NWL Head Referee

A disgraced former referee, Manny has a history of match-fixing and unethical behavior. Known for his shady background, including stealing the original IWA Championship belt and making false accusations, he was ultimately brought back to the NWL as head referee after Luthor and Jack Cornette discovered him refereeing underground bum fights. Cornette explained, "Luthor believes in second chances."

Alexa Ivory – Al

Alexa Ivory is Luthor Alexander's Al assistant in the National Wrestling League (NWL). Created from a blend of Commodore 64 parts and the remains of Rob the Robot, she is an advanced yet quirky artificial intelligence responsible for managing the official rankings in the league.

FROM THE DESK OF JACK CORNETTE NWL ADMINISTRATOR

Let me make this real clear before some meathead from Maryland misquotes me again—I don't run with the Dogg House Crew. Never have. Never needed to. I stand on my own two feet, with the backing of the only man in this business whose vision actually matters—Luthor Alexander. So when I hear Garrie Morris—that backwoods conspiracy nut with the charisma of a traffic cone—saying I'm playing both sides? That I'm part of some secret rebellion? How dare you.

You think I'd ever betray Luthor? That I'd throw away the future of this company for some half-baked undercard uprising built in your grandmother's garage? Let me tell you something, Garrie I was here before your little tin badge squad showed up, and I'll still be here when your Maryland Militia fizzles out and goes back to playing pretend in crab shack parking lots.

And speaking of Maryland, what the hell is in Maryland anyway? A flag that looks like a clown threw up on a checkerboard, and a population that thinks putting seasoning on a dead sea bug is a personality trait. Your entire roster is a joke, your best fighter looks like he just lost a slap fight with a rotisserie chicken. And as for you? I've seen more ring awareness in toddlers on bounce houses. You've got the agility of a refrigerator and the dating success of a gas station urinal.

And don't think I forgot Reiko Suave Valentino, the walking cologne commercial with a filmography straight out of the bargain bin. I saw Save the Last Dance 2: Electric Boogaloo. That wasn't a movie, it was a crime against humanity in slow motion. If that's your idea of a comeback, I'd rather sit through a Garrie Morris promo marathon.

Now let's talk about Rumble in the Bronx. The "big stage." The spotlight. The hype. Funny how we're all supposed to be impressed by a city where the rats outnumber the wrestling fans and the smell of body spray can't cover the scent of desperation. But you know what, Garrie? That's your moment. And you're going to choke on it. Because when the dust settles in Yankee Stadium, the world's going to see that while you were busy connecting dots and chasing ghosts, I was busy building empires.

Luthor doesn't need to question my loyalty. But you? You better start questioning your chances of walking out of the Bronx in one piece.







<u>BITE THIS</u> <u>WITH VIC VENOM</u>



"Welcome to Bite This! I'm Akeem Bixenspan, stepping in for Vic Venom.

"First up, Bullman Bolt channeled every thunder god in recorded mythology. Thor. Zeus. Shango. The Weather Channel. He said he's not fighting Skapegoat—he's obliterating him. And after that? He's coming for Luthor Alexander and Johnny B with enough fury to be classified as an atmospheric event."

"Then there's Brian Clothier, taking shots at Arcane like he was trying out for amateur night at the comedy club. Only problem? Arcane isn't just strange—he's interstellar. Clothier got abducted, dunked in syrup, and force-fed punchlines like some sort of cosmic IHOP hostage. And now? Arcane's calling for a two-on-one match against him and Magnum T'Eh."

"Back on Earth—barely—Fish Fam dropped their latest tag team promo from inside a bodega. Sausage nunchucks. Glitter bombs. Microwaves on high. And more Bronx energy than a B-boy battle during a blackout. They mocked their Russian opponents so hard I'm shocked there wasn't an international incident."

"Lucky Dice Vegas re-emerged like James Bond with better odds. Said he is the house now. Casino Royale Champ. No crew. Just chips, charm, and title gold. The man rolled double sixes like fate just doubled down."

"Then GeeZus turned CWL into a confessional booth. Walked right into Kamikaze's new home and called him a fraud. Said the National Title doesn't belong in CWL—it belongs with a fighter. And GeeZus? He's here to collect."

"He doubled down outside under a flickering Bronx streetlamp. Called Kamikaze a ghost-chasing coward. Said he's not chasing belts—he's chasing reckoning. And whether Kamikaze shows up or not, GeeZus is coming to Rumble in the Bronx."

"And then there's Reiko Suave Valentino. Thinks he's too real for Hollywood. Powerbombed his co-star through a table. His words, not mine: 'BIG BANK TAKES LIL BANK.' Apparently the red carpet leads straight to the squared circle now."

"G-Force Morris cornered Jack Cornette and all but accused him of engineering the No-Win Organization. Said Bullman was a decoy. Called the Dogg House Crew Cornette's foot soldiers. And just when you think it's just words, Henry Heeler shows up like a silent bomb ticking in the background."

"Elsewhere, Mark Botch led Fish Fam in 'The Botch Method'—a training montage involving soda curls, remote lifts, and bean dip landings. Forget squats. They're winning with flavor and foam fingers."

"I think that already happened..."

Vic (snaps): "SHUT UP, AKEEM."

"Well. That escalated."

[Screen fades out with the Bite This! logo and a voiceover:]
"Live from Yankee Stadium... see you at the Rumble."

LIVE WITH NWL COMMISSIONER LUTHOR ALEXANDER



The time for warnings has passed. The time for mercy was never on the table. This Rumble in the Bronx isn't a spectacle.

It's a reckoning. Skapegoat, you were brought into this war to extinguish fire with fury. Bullman Bolt thinks he's a symbol, a storm. But you are the flood. I want him broken. I want him silenced. I want the rebellion buried in Yankee Stadium. The Grand Prix Championship hangs between three men clawing at power: Morris chases answers, Heeler craves validation, and Ozzy brings oblivion. That match won't crown a champion, it will leave casualties. Kamikaze defends the National Title, but GeeZus isn't here for belts. He's come to repossess pride. If Kamikaze doesn't show up, he forfeits everything. Magnum T'Eh and El Luchador Americano aren't fighting for victory, they're battling for identity itself. Fish Fam will defend the National Tag Titles against the cold, efficient rage of Dimitry Tokarev and Vladimir Volkov. Chaos versus control, glitter versus steel. Brian Clothier's mockery of Arcane will cost him dearly, because Arcane is not a joke. He's inevitability. And then there's the Six-Man Tag. The No-Win Organization steps into the crosshairs. They call themselves a movement. I call them a disease. I will hand-pick the cure. But none of that compares to what waits at the end of the night. The 20-man RUMBLE IN THE BRONX Match. Elimination by over-the-top into the pit of pain. Thumbtacks. Barbed wire. Broken glass. Live scorpions. Blood, fire, and steel. No rules. No alliances. Just survival. The man left standing doesn't just win the night ,he survives a nightmare. This is not about wrestling. This is about survival. And when the night ends, I will decide who still exists. Rumble in the Bronx is the end of history, and I will be the one who writes what comes next.

(Luthor Alexander looks up from his desk. The office is silent. Then, with a calm smile)
"Can I help you, Garrie?"





TWA STRAFET BASIGS

There are two sides to the IWA game; storyline and strategy. We will go into creating your wrestler's persona and promos elsewhere, but here we will break down the core elements of strategy, tracking holds, picking holds and where you place them all come into play. Everyone wants to win and in the IWA, your wrestler wins when they outscore their opponent. Now there may be 90 different holds, but lucky for you, there are only about a third of them that you have consider to be 'in play'.

The page dedicated to the Gold Federation Hold chart will help you to know which of those holds are worth using, but which ones you pick are up to you. You and your opponent each select your wrestler's 15 holds and in a match they have their strategies compared to each other. In a singles match, the higher scoring hold at each spot wins out and at the end of the match, the difference will determine who won. Here are a few examples of what a singles, tag team and six-man match results look like and what the information included means.

Monster Truck Tanaka bested Neo Dragon at 16:45 (Love Glove Lock) by 7

[In this match, Tanaka's strategy totaled 7points higher than Neo's and his custom finishing move is shown at the end. Non-title matches have a 30 minute time limit and the closers the score, the closer it will be to the time limit, but if it is a blowout win, then the time will be much shorter.]

"Country Hammer" Rhett Grady drew LNW: Stevie Vertigo at 2:59 (Double Count Out)

[Note: This match ended in a tie because both wrestler's strategies totaled up to the same amount. If a match ends in a tie, the IWA uses a randomizer to determine if it will be labeled as a Double Disqualification, Double count out, Time-limit draw, No contest, draw and so on.]

MEOW: El Raya Escorpion* and M.E.O.W.: El Barbaro beat PAD: Colonel Doom and The Pharmacist Rx Pain* at 18:15 (Catfish Party Crash) by 11 [Note: this tag match saw the wrestler who won the match and the wrestler who took the fall both marked with a *. There are many stables in the IWA and players use initials to signify which stable they are in. In this team MEOW = Team Meow and PAD = Pain & Destruction. This match was a First Blood match and you can add a stipulation to any match by adding it when you send your matches in to the IWA.]

Alec Von Snapp*, Axel Von Snapp, and Alex Von Snapp won over Dave "The Decision" Wasilewski, Rod Camino, and WAZ* at 29:48 (Flood Insurance) by 2 (Guest Referee: "Highlight of The Night" Johny Vegas).

[Note: In a six-man match, the scores of all three wrestlers on each team are compared at each spot and the hold with the highest value will represent their team's score against the other team. Guest Referees are triggered when a certain score is reached and are assigned randomly. Trash Talk Tips:

Be Active: The most important part is to be active and have your wrestler talk! That is how you can get others to understand them. It doesn't have to be fancy; whatever fits your style! Also, respond to other managers who mention you. Be patient; sometimes it takes a few cycles to get a response. Being specific helps get others attention as well.

Make it easy to read: Do not use overly fancy fonts or have really large blocks of text. Use BOLD when you mention other wrestlers to get their attention. This helps in Have a header or picture for others to easily follow along.

Talking about others: Always try to make your opponents look strong. Pay attention to what the other wrestlers say or do. Do they have a valet or drive a certain car? Use that in your responses. Go with the flow; sometimes someone will take your response in a different direction than you intend. Let your character develop.

Stay true to your and your opponent's characters as best as you can. Senor Lucha, Rachel van Dorn, Future Man, Greg E. Money, & Punk Rock Mike are all very different characters. How would they react to in your scenario?

Reference the Bulletin: Use events that happened in the bulletin: Did someone have an open challenge? Did a rival throw you out of the Battle Royal or vice versa? Did you win a match in your hometown? These are great starting points for your trash talk. Look at the commissioner's report too for upcoming contests and events. Get involved!

Make it repeatable: Set up a format that works for you and that is easy to repeat every three weeks. You might not always have creative energy or be busy in life. Having a guick format that you just fill in can make it easy if you are stuck and let you continue a storyline you have started. Also, adding in some signature lines can help

Reach out to others: A good first step is reaching out to the commissioner with any ideas. Collaborating with other players adds to the enjoyment and can take a feud to the next level.

[Promo Segment: "Autopsy of Arcane" – Final Cut]

[FADE IN: Cold, clinical silence. A dimly lit medical examiner's room. Stainless steel walls. A single autopsy table sits under a spotlight. Strapped down at the center is ARCANE — arms and legs bound, breathing shallow and quick. He wears no robes, just standard-issue black trunks. There's no mystical aura — just sterile dread.]

[A low hum. Fluorescent lights buzz. His eyes snap open.]

Arcane (blinking, confused):

"... Where am I...?"

[A second light flickers on. Standing beside the table in a hazmat suit: Geraldo Rivera, microphone in hand, flanked by a shaky VHS-style camcorder crew. A bold, retro graphic appears on screen: "EXCLUSIVE: ALIEN AUTOPSY – THE KALIDASA FILES."]

Geraldo (to camera):

"Good evening. I'm Geraldo Rivera, reporting live from an undisclosed bunker somewhere under the ice shelf of Nunavut. Tonight, we peel back the layers of truth to expose the greatest secret in the galaxy—" (turns to Arcane)

"This... is the last surviving specimen of an alien intelligence from the fifth planet in the twin star system of Kalidasa and Kalidisi."

[He pulls back a sheet, revealing Arcane's face. Arcane grits his teeth.]

Geraldo (dramatically):

"The craft was pulled from a crater in rural Manitoba. Inside? A dozen velvet bodysuits, a translator orb, and over six hundred bottles of Canadian Maple No. 3 syrup. Officials are baffled."

[Arcane struggles in his restraints.]

Arcane (through clenched teeth):

"I am not your experiment. I am a warrior-artist. From a culture that values combat as creation. Wrestling... is expression."

Geraldo (mocking):

"He believes... wrestling is art. Fascinating."

[Enter the MEDICAL EXAMINER — face hidden by a disposable surgical mask. He calmly picks up a scalpel. Geraldo steps back.]

Arcane (more urgent):

"This is wrong. You don't understand. The ring is sacred. You are desecrating it—"

[The M.E. leans in. The scalpel gleams in the light. Then, he lowers his mask—revealing: The Great Entertainer Brian Clothier. Smiling.]

Clothier (softly):

"Funny... I've been meaning to cut the art class." (He winks)

"Let's see what makes you tick, Picasso."

[He lowers the scalpel toward Arcane's chest—]

[SMASH CUT TO BLACK.]

[INT. WRESTLER'S LOCKER ROOM - NIGHT]

[Arcane jolts upright in a folding chair, sweat pouring down his brow. The room is dim, quiet. His robe hangs over a nearby locker. His hands tremble. No one else is there.]

[He stares into the mirror across the room. Is it over? Was it real?]

[Whispers echo faintly in his ears—Geraldo's voice:]

"The last survivor... of Kalidasa..."

[Arcane breathes deeply, steadying himself. Then, blackout.]



[Scene: Backstage locker room. The Maryland Militia's banner hangs in the background. G-Force Garrie Morris stands with arms crossed as Brian Clothier straightens his bowtie in front of a mirror, wiping syrup residue off his cufflinks.]

GARRIE MORRIS: What happened last week? I found your car idling in the lot. Door wide open. Engine purring. But no sign of *you*. You're just gone. And when I *do* find you? You're drenched in syrup and smelling like a pancake. You ready to tell me what the hell happened?

[Clothier glares into the mirror. Slightly embarrassed. Greatly irritated. He adjusts his collar.]

BRIAN CLOTHIER: Drop it. I don't want to talk about... *that*. I got something in the works. Now let's talk about something that actually matters. You still think Jack Cornette's behind Bullman Bolt's re-emergence?

GARRIE: Everywhere that freak shows up, Cornette's already vanished. You connect the dots.

BRIAN: Alright then. You gonna press anyone else? Maybe Todd Ockerlund? He's got that shady smirk and a Rolodex that'd make the FBI nervous.

GARRIE: He's on the list. You don't chew a toothpick like that unless you're hiding something.

[Clothier smirks.]

BRIAN: Could be Luthor, y'know. Luthor would be the ultimate inside job, and you said it yourself; you think this was an inside job. He lets Bolt loose, makes Cornette look guilty as he has grown tired of him, clears the chessboard.

GARRIE: I dunno. My gut doesn't believe it, and the evidence doesn't support it.

BRIAN: I still wouldn't put it past him, I've heard what he is capable of. *But... if it ain't him.* What about Traci?

[A long silence. They both consider it.]

GARRIE: She's calculated enough. But she's not reckless. Still... can't rule her out. I could see her trying to make a power play against Luthor.


BRIAN: Then there's Vic Venom. What if Bolt "took him out" on purpose? Frame job. Pin it on Cornette. Buy sympathy points. You take the hit, make the play. Classic misdirection plus get a paid FMLA vacation out of it.

GARRIE (shaking his head): No way. Vic Venom doesn't come across to me as someone that would want to get knocked around even at a quarter of Bullman Bolt's power. All those theories are cute, but Cornette's still *public enemy number one*. The motive is there, all the dots connect back to him. I'll talk to Ockerlund. See what he knows about Cornette.

BRIAN: As important as the Bullman Bolt exposé, don't forget you have a Grand Prix title match at Rumble in the Bronx. You need to be just as prepared for that, as you are at solving who brought in Bullman Bolt.

GARRIE: Oh I haven't forgot, infact, I'm going to make it a point to let everyone especially Ozzy, Heeler and Cornette know I'm on my "A" game. That belt is as good as mine.

[FADE OUT.]



[The crowd erupts with boos as "Seven Nation Army" blasts through the speakers. G-Force Garrie Morris strides to the ring in his Maryland bomber jacket, a calm storm behind the shades. He rolls into the ring and demands a mic.]

GARRIE MORRIS: "I just competed in the most grueling, most brutal proving ground the IWA has to offer—the Fifty States Battle Royals. One winner from each state. Fifty-one battle royals. One per state, plus D.C. And your boy? G-Force Garrie Morris? I entered 'em ALL… and I walked out a TOP FOUR FINALIST in DC! The best finish out of anyone in the NWL. Jack Cornette, That ain't luck. That ain't fate. That's grind. That's work. That's Maryland's NEW IRON MAN puttin' the boots to complacency and takin' names while the rest of these punks are still lacin' up their boots! And now, I've got ONE name left to cross off the list…"

[Garrie turns toward the entrance, pulling his sunglasses off slowly.]

"Ozzy Dethstrike... get your championship-carryin', eyeliner-wearin', fake metal mess out here. Because I'm not waiting until Rumble in the Bronx to find out if the Grand Prix title's still got a heartbeat."

[Cue Ozzy Dethstrike's entrance music – power chords scream through the arena as the NWL Grand Prix Champion storms toward the ring, belt slung over his shoulder, eyes burning through dark makeup. He climbs in and stands across from G-Force. The tension is thick. But it gets *thicker*.]

[Cue Madd Dogg Henry Heeler's theme. The place comes unglued. Heeler marches down, teeth bared, snarling. He slides into the ring, now forming a perfect triangle with G-Force and Ozzy. No one moves. The crowd is deafening.

[Then it happens.]

GARRIE MORRIS (grinning): "You boys are lookin' tense. Let me loosen things up."

[Morris SNAPS into action—cheapshotting Ozzy with a sudden right hand, then grabbing him by the hair and throwing him directly toward Heeler. Without missing a beat—BAM!—Heeler lunges forward and hits Ozzy with the Ozark Spear, splitting the champion in half. The crowd loses it. Ozzy crumples to the mat, and Heeler rises slowly—eyes locked on G-Force. Garrie kneels beside the fallen champion, almost mockingly... then grabs him again.]

GARRIE: "Still breathin"? Lemme fix that."

[He hoists Ozzy up and drills him with Turbulence—a front falling Russian leg sweep. Ozzy is *done*. Refs rush in to pull him out of the ring, leaving the Grand Prix title lying in the center of the mat.]

[Now just Morris and Heeler remain. Silent. Stone-faced. The championship glinting between them.]

[They step closer. Nose to nose. The crowd is frothing at te mouth.]

[No fists. Not yet. Just the silent promise of destruction.]

[Fade out on the image of the Grand Prix title resting at their feet—neither man flinching.]



[Fluorescent lights hum overhead. A grizzled Garrie Morris leans forward at a metal table, sleeves rolled slightly up, eyes locked on the man across from him — the smug, slick-haired Todd Ockerlund, wearing aviators indoors and chewing a toothpick like it owes him money. A two-way mirror looms beside them. Tension could be bottled.]

GARRIE MORRIS: Let's try this again, Todd. For the record. Where were you when Bullman Bolt appeared at the PPV?

[Did I ever tell you about the '92 semifinals? Rochester versus Sudbury. Overtime. I lost three teeth, shattered a stick, and kissed a ref's sister all in the same shift.]

GARRIE (annoyed): This ain't the damn ECHL, Ockerlund. I'm not askin' for your hockey card stats. I'm askin' about *Cornette*. Is he the one pullin' the leash on Bolt?

TODD: Cornette? Oh, buddy, Cornette couldn't leash a golden retriever. You ever see him try to tie his shoes? Man wears loafers for a reason.

GARRIE (slamming his fist on the table): Stop skatin' around the truth! Every time Bolt snaps, Cornette disappears. Coincidence? I don't believe in those.

TODD (still calm): You want answers? Call the NWL hotline. Option three, after the merch menu. Real spicy stuff. First minute's only—

[Garrie suddenly slaps Todd hard across the face.]

GARRIE: You think this is a game? This isn't pay-per-listen. People are gettin' hurt out there. *I'm* gettin' left in the dark.

[A knock echoes from the other side of the mirror. Garrie turns, walks toward the door, opens it. Standing just outside is **HER**—TRACI "Cold eyes. Impeccable suit. Voice like a warning.]

TRACI: You have until the pay-per-view, Garrie. That's it. Luthor's confident in your plan.

[She pauses, then leans in slightly.]

TRACI But that's not a sentiment I share.

[She turns and walks away without another word, heels clicking down the corridor like a ticking clock. Garrie watches her go, jaw tight, then slowly pulls out his cellphone. Dials.]

GARRIE (into phone): Brian. Bring the bolt cutters.

[The camera lingers on Garrie's eyes. Focused. Burning. The truth is close—and it's gonna take more than questions to rip it out. **FADE OUT.**]

[INT. NWL LOCKER ROOM - NIGHT]

[The room is silent, lit only by the dull hum of overhead fluorescents. The Great Entertainer Brian Clothier stands at his locker, and hangs a doctor's gown from a hook at the back of the locker.] [He reaches into his pocket, pulls out a surgical mask, and drapes it over the same hook — the straps dangling like a noose.]

[He pauses. Breathes. Composed. Clean. Cold.]

[As he starts to close the locker door, the camera pushes in — low, slow — and catches a glimpse inside a darkened corner of the locker: a pair of heavy bolt cutters. Black-handled. Scarred. Waiting 1

[The camera holds on them. Long enough to ask a question. Long enough to feel dread.] [FADE TO BLACK.]



[CAMERA OPENS in the NWL training area. MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH is nervously pacing in front of a heavy bag he's clearly not using. He's decked out in a tight, bright blue "FISH FAN 4 LIFE" shirt, sweatbands on his wrists, and cargo shorts with mustard stains. A half-eaten sub sandwich is tucked into his fanny pack like a sidearm.]

MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH: "Okay. Deep breaths, Mark. Deep breaths. It's *just* Rumble in the Bronx. Just the most dangerous match in NWL history. Just... y'know... thumbtacks. Barbed wire. Broken glass. And actual... real-life... **scorpions**?!"

[He shudders.]

MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH: "I thought getting eliminated meant you just fall on the floor—not into a terrarium of nature's most stabby insects!"

[He pulls out a laminated pamphlet labeled "Arachnids: A Survival Guide."]

MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH: "I'm not even sure if I'm *in* the match... but knowing my luck, I'll trip over the top rope trying to help and land headfirst into the danger zone while eating nachos!"

[He sighs, then perks up slightly.]

MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH: "But even if I gotta wear a beekeeper suit and two pairs of socks... I'll be there. *Because the Fish Fam needs me.*"

[He slaps the "FISH FAN" logo on his shirt. It jiggles slightly.]

MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH: "Chillindrina and Mickamus are defending the tag team gold against the Soviet skyscrapers of sadness—Dimitry Tokarev and Vladimir Volkov. These dudes look like they stepped right outta Rocky IV. I keep waitin' for one of them to shout, 'I must break you...'"

[He does a bad Russian accent.]

MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH (as Volkov): "Is not personal. Is just... pulverization." MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH (back to himself): "That's not normal, bro!"

[He nervously looks off-camera like one of them might appear.]

MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH: "But you know what those two don't have? They don't have faith. They don't have heart. And they *definitely* don't have GeeZus."

[He points to the sky dramatically... then loses balance and stumbles into the heavy bag, barely catching himself.]

MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH: "The Fish Fam's got *GeeZus...* and they got *The Fan*. That's basically divine backup... and a snack break in the same corner."

[He raises a juice box triumphantly.]

MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH: "So whether I'm out there fighting, flopping, or falling into a tank of angry insects... I'll be there for my team. And if I have to throw myself in front of a Russian boot to save our gold—well..."

[He pauses, thinks for a second.]

MARK "THE FAN" BOTCH: "Actually, lemme talk to Chillindrina about that. Maybe I can help more from the merch table."

[Screen fades to black as he waddles off with determination and a trail of cookie crumbs.]

The lights in the NWL arena pulse with intensity as the camera cuts backstage. The lens shakes slightly as a production assistant scrambles to keep up with 'Madd Dogg' Henry Heeler, who storms toward the interview set, his entire frame brimming with unchained fury. The Grand Prix Championship, the one stolen from his grasp, now dangles in the balance—and Henry is ready to take back what's his.



Henry Heeler: "I don't give a damn about Garrie Morris. He's a passenger in this collision course. There's only one name that matters—**Ozzy Deathstrike.**"

Henry clenches his fists, his breathing heavy as he steadies himself.

Henry Heeler: "You remember what happened last time you stood in my way, Ozzy? You crumbled beneath the Ozark Spear. You had to be scraped off the floor. I made an example out of you, and yet—you still have the audacity to walk into Rumble in the Bronx with my Title over your shoulder?"

The interviewer shifts nervously, holding the microphone steady as Henry takes a step closer.

Henry Heeler: "This isn't a fight. This is a reckoning. I don't care what Jack Cornette had to do to get this match signed. I don't care what the suits in the back have planned. All that matters is when that bell rings, you're stepping into my hellfire, Ozzy. You were handed that belt, but you won't leave with it."

Henry's gaze hardens, his eyes cold, unforgiving.

Henry Heeler: "The Grand Prix Championship belongs to me. And at Rumble in the Bronx—Ozzy Deathstrike won't just lose the title. He'll lose the last scrap of respect he has left."

With that, Henry shoves the microphone aside and storms out of the shot, leaving the interviewer stunned and the audience buzzing with anticipation. The warfor the Grand Prix Championship is set—the 'Madd Dogg' is coming, and nothing will stop him.

The arena lights suddenly dim, plunging the crowd into darkness. A new entrance can be heard—Feed the Machine by Poor Man's Poison replaces the silence, its ominous melody sending ripples of confusion through the fans. Then, as the hook drops, a wave of flame pyrotechnics erupts across the arena, bathing the space in a fiery glow...and a few stray fireballs. Chaos briefly ensues, with a few startled spectators scrambling from the nosebleeds on fire. As the smoke clears and the lights return, Rusty Chains emerges, sauntering down the runway with the NWL League Championship fastened securely around his waist. Rusty enters the ring and grabs a mic before his new entrance music fades.



Rusty Chains: Ladies and gentlemen, fans of all ages... *MY WRESTLEVERSE!* Let me chat at ya for a minute.

For 100% of my NWL career, I've held a championship title of one form or another. (*The fans erupt into chants of "Oh-Oh Rusty Chai-ains!"*) I've battled the best this league has to offer, time and time again. I'm a 2-time Rookie Brawl Champion. I've held the NWL T.V. Tile. I went toe-to-toe with the A.I., stripped them of their titles, one by one. I brought a name to the NWL by becoming a Specialty Tournament Record holder.

I pulled second in the 'Extreme Rulez Tournament', where I showed my pure brutality and grit. I used that as fuel to win the 'Hardcore Tournament'....and then came the 'Hell in the Cell Tournament'! After the previous Tournaments, there was 'No Excuses' for my win! I was 8th in the 'I Quit Tournament' which led me to win the 'Singapore Cane Tournament'...Making me a 3-Time Specialty Tournament winner for the NWL!

At my first PLE, I gave Chainsaw Henley *No Excuses*—because there's no room for sentiment in this business. I led the DHC to become one of the most dominant Six-Man Champions this league has ever seen. (*The crowd's cheers swell to a roar.*)

TODAY... Today, Wrestleverse, I stand before you as your **NWL League Champion.**

And this—THIS—is the pinnacle of any wrestlers' NWL career. This title isn't just gold and leather; it's legacy, respect, power. When I stepped foot into NWL for the first time, this was the prize I had my eyes set on. This was the Championship Title I wanted. And now, I hold it—because I earned it, because I bled for it, because I proved beyond a shadow of a doubt that I am the best this league has ever seen! (Rusty raises the belt high as the crowd erupts again.)

But, folks, this moment is bittersweet. My time in the NWL is coming to an end. My contract is set to expire, and the commissioner of the WTL, Cactus Jaques, has called me up to fulfill my draft deal.

Since I began here, I've fought, scratched, and clawed my way to the top, and I've loved every second of it. You, my Wrestleverse, have been the heartbeat of my journey. Without you — your passion, your chants, your unwavering loyalty — I wouldn't be standing here as one of the most dominant forces this league has ever seen. (*The crowd erupts into cheers chanting "Thank you, Rusty!"*)

But make no mistake—I'm not riding off into the sunset just yet. No, no, no. Before I take my leave, I plan on stacking my legacy even higher. I WILL walk out of here with a couple more NWL titles. I WILL remind every single competitor why Rusty Chains runs this business. And when I step into the WTL, I won't just represent myself—I'll represent each and every one of you.

So, NWL... enjoy your League Champion while you can. Because there is 'No Excuses' for my Dominance and there is 'No Excuses' your loyalty. I'll see you in the Wild West Wrestleverse!"



The lights flicker. The air hums with tension. The crowd waits, restless, electric. Then, the voice of Arcane cuts through the noise like a blade through fog—steady, deliberate, a mix of amusement and quiet menace.



Arcane: "Tokyo. Two against one. A battle where odds favored not the tactician, but the desperate. And yet, Brian Clothier and Magnum T'Eh found themselves clawing, scrambling, barely holding on as I dissected their arrogance move by move. I nearly toppled them. I **almost** proved that intelligence triumphs over brute force, over fragile egos wrapped in showmanship.

But 'almost' is a word that doesn't sit well with me, Clothier. And that is why, at *Rumble in the Bronx*, there will be no 'almost.' No distractions. No partners to lean on. Just you. Just me. And the inevitable conclusion that will shatter every illusion you've built around yourself."

Arcane steps forward, his presence looming, calculated.

"You see, Jack Cornette calls this match a clash of ideology and ego, but tell me, Clothier—what ideology do you stand for? Cheap entertainment? Hollow victories built on interference? The illusion of greatness, carefully manufactured through deception?

Your brand is **performance**. Mine is **precision**. You taunt, you mock, you play for laughs—while I calculate, I strike, I conquer.

You boast about being 'The Great Entertainer,' but understand this: at *Rumble in the Bronx*, there will be no jokes, no syrup, no spectacle to save you. You will stand across from me, exposed, alone, and you will learn firsthand that charisma crumbles when faced with cold, ruthless reality."

Arcane leans in, his tone dipping into something darker.

"And when it's over—when the dust settles and the crowd stares at the broken remains of the man who thought he was untouchable—I won't need to say a word.

Because the message will be loud enough."

Arcane smirks, steps back, and the screen fades to black.





[Backstage. The hallway is dim, lit only by flickering overhead lights. You hear the muffled roar of the crowd. The camera pans slowly to GeeZuS—in his signature red track suit with a little extra flare, gold cross with EDGE and FF etched on it, hanging heavy, head bowed like he's in prayer.]

GeeZuS (low, preacher voice):

"They say before battle... the warriors of old would speak to the gods. Ask them to be blessed, to guide them through the night."

But I don't need the gods tonight.

I need these hands.

I need this rage.

And I need Kamikaze to step in that ring... and finally stop runnin'."

He raises his head. Eyes locked. No smile. Just war in his voice.

GeeZuS:

"Kamikaze...

You been everywhere but where you need to be, yet nowhere to be seen.

Treatin' that NWL Championship like a vacation souvenir.

But tonight, it ends for good.

Tonight, you not in Tokyo.

You not in London.

You in The Bronx.

And in The Bronx, we don't run.

We rumble."

He rips off his track jacket. The crowd noise swells faintly behind him.

GeeZuS (voice rising):
"You ain't facin' a challenger.
Your reckoning is finally here.

You facin' the man who bled for his faith and the NWL. Who led a family. Who built a kingdom while you were busy chasin' dreams like they made you immortal.

This ain't just another defense.

This ain't another city.

This is judgment day... and I'm the preacher holdin' court."

He steps toward gorilla position. You "Only God Can Judge me" by Tupac start to rumble faintly.

GeeZuS (final stare into camera):

"Let the world watch. Let the Bronx roar.

And when the dust clears and the madness settles,
Only one name gonna be ringin' through this arena—

And it ain't Kamikaze.

It's Gee. ZuS.

And the belt's comin' home."

[He turns his back, walking toward the curtain. The lights flash red and gold. The crowd erupts as the screen fades to black.]



"Buy One, Beat Two"

Outside the Rumble in the Bronx Arena — right next to the hot dog cart. Fold-out table covered in crumpled "FISH FAM" t-shirts, a few glittery foam fish fingers, and a sketchy cash box. Fans swarm around as a handmade sign reads: "Official-ish Merch – CASH, CHIPS, OR RESPECT ONLY"

[Camera rolls as Chillindrina stands on top of a milk crate with a megaphone. Supa Mickamus (who is looking a little more portly than usual) spins in circles with two shirts on. Botch is slumped in a camping chair behind the table eating a churro.]

Chillindrina (screaming through megaphone):
"STEP RIGHT UP! GET YOUR LIMITED-EDITION, SWEAT-INFUSED, BORSCHT-RESISTANT FISH FAM
GEAR!!"

Mickamus (yelling while spinning):
"You want heat? We got the drip!
You want the titles? TOO BAD, BABY!
Like Kentucky, the Russians are gonna fry tonight!!"

Botch (mumbling with churro dust on his lips): "Buy a shirt, get a free nap... maybe."

[Camera zooms in as Chillindrina hops off the crate, holding a foam fish finger like a sword.]

Chillindrina:

"Vlad and Dimitry wanna act all serious and scary like two bears with joint pain—but this Bronx ain't built for quiet little cold war comebacks! This is OUR HOUSE!"

Mickamus:

"They train in silence, we train in snacks. (Mickamus seems to be running out of breath.)
